

Campgrounds Grow

New Ones Springing Up as Older Ones Expand

THE CAMPING craze has sparked myriad new facilities all over Florida. A new Kampgrounds of America seashore campground on Alligator Point on the northern Gulf Coast will accommodate travel trailers, tents and tent trailers. Good fishing, shrimping and scalloping invite tasty catch-your-own dining.

A 600 acre Ramada Camp Inn on the Suwannee River near Interstate 10 will open in early 1973 with 200 sites

and plans for still more. Tennis courts and a swimming pool will be included.

Two large scale campgrounds near Leesburg offer the bonus of proximity to Walt Disney World Holiday Trav-L-Park, on the southeast shore of Lake Griffin, where the fishing is topnotch, has 300 sites. The Wildwood **Continental Camper**, with 320 sites, borders Lake Ocklawaha.

Deep in the Everglades, Trail Lakes Campground opened along Highway 41, the Tamiami Trail. It's one of the few in the area and offers a welcome overnight stop between Naples and Miami.

On the south side of Lake Okeechobee, just east of Clewiston, the Crooked Hook Campground offers a full array of recreational facilities.

On Key Largo, the Happy Vagabond's 12 acres accommodate campers, in recreational vehicles or tents.

Farther down, Outwood **Resorts** on Long Key is a \$4 million facility for travel trailers. The park is laced with canals and offers an Olympic size pool, complete marina, recreation center and health spa. Sites may be rented or purchased.
